Although this map is a printed copy of a Mss map based on a O.S. Landranger Map N^o 71 source, it is included here purely because it is likely to be a accurate up to date portrayal of the Hunt boundaries as at 1984. The area covered is from Bamburgh South to the A1 around Longframlington/ Felton. Strangely it does not identify the Hunt Meets.

Map coverage shows the whole of the Isle of Anglesey and is on a scale of 1/2 Inch to 1 Mile. The number of meets is 1-37 listed & again marked with a **red cross & black Number** on map face, ALL meets are outside of the marked 'Lord Anglesey's Hunting Country' [which shows NO marked Meets] indicating a more extensive hunt on Anglesey, raising the question had the current Marquis given up the Mastership of a hunt? plainly he had NOT given up his hunt territory. The enlarged full island map now shows much less detail than the previous partial map.

Prior the son of the steward to Sir John Danvers of Swithland Hall had at the age of only fifteen, been in charge of the village school and later curate at Quorn and Woodhouse. The survey [County] started in 1775 and was completed in 1777.

"Mr Prior's Pocket Map of Leicestershire for Sportsmen" 1787 22" x 20"

The title of this little known map goes on to describe it as : " with additions from the adjoining counties." and in fact it covers the area between Birmingham in the west to Grantham in the east and from Ashbourne in the north to Rugby in the south. It is a fox hunting map and all the principal fox coverts are shown coloured. The imprint on the map states that it was : "Sold by W.Dawson No. 7 Paternoster Row London and I.Gregory in Leicester."

Note

A current location for the above [reduced] map in its original state is unknown so if found it must be considered extremely rare. DD mentions a 1819 copy in Cheltenham's Ladys' College [unseen]

The 4 sht map was still offered for sale by William Faden in 1822, it is described as '[LEICESTER, surveyed by John Prior; Second Edition four sheets. £1.0.0.](#)' The original from which the reduced version of the map is sourced.

Perhaps the multiplicity of advertisements for 'Horse Slaughterer', with a crude illustration of how this is achieved might indicate it's connection to horses, stables and hunting.

This basically is a black and white Area map [of the South West of Birmingham, South to Worcester/ West to Ludlow/North to Birmingham /East to Alcester] with a Town Plan for Kidderminster derived from the current O.S 6". The map and plan are surrounded by advertisements for the areas covered.
